

Subject: "NO OBJECTION" TO USE FRAMEWORK CONTRACT AGREEMENT TO AWARD CONTRACT TO AMINATA & SONS FOR THE SUPPLY AND DELIVERY OF PETROLEUM PRODUCTS FOR FISCAL YEAR-2025

We present our compliments and wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter dated February 7, 2025, which sought the approval of the Commission for the Liberia National Police (LNP) to award framework contracts to Aminata and Sons for the supply and delivery of Petroleum Products Fuel Oil ("the Goods") for a unit price not to exceed four United States Dollars and twenty-one cents (US \$4.21) per gallon.

The Commission notes your assertions and wish to inform you that the intent of Liberia National Police (LNP) to award contracts to Aminata and Sons for the supplies of the goods as indicated above, is in compliance with the PPCA, 2010, and thus advises that the LNP proceed to sign framework agreement with Aminata and Sons for unit prices of US\$4.21 per gallon of Fuel Oil.

Kindly be reminded that all contracts which cumulative annual value exceeds the threshold of US\$250,000.00 must be signed by the Minister responsible for Finance and attested to by the Minister responsible for Justice. The Commission requires that you kindly forward copies of all stipulated contracts upon signing so as to update our records.

The Public Procurement and Concessions Commission admonishes and deems it a priority that you remain in compliance with the PPCA, 2010, as we jointly aspire to achieve transparency, accountability, fairness, equality and ultimately public confidence in our procurement and concessions processes.

Ref. Request for No Objection to enter into Framework Agreement/Contract

Dear Hon. Johnson:

We present our compliments and write to inform you that the Liberia National Police has conducted its Restricted Bidding process toward the award of Framework Agreement for the supply of Petroleum Product to the Aminata & Sons Inc. (IFB No.LNP/SBA/RB/001/2025 value at One Million Five Eighty-eight Thousand Five Hundred and Eighty Seven United States Dollars (US\$1,588.587) as allotted for 2025 fiscal period while awaiting the passage of the National Budget before the signing of the final Framework Agreement.

The Liberia National Police therefore request "No Objection" from the Commission of its intent to enter into framework agreement/contracts with Aminata & Sons Inc for the Supply of Petroleum Product to the Liberia National Police.

This request is in compliance with Section 31, which states that except in the case of emergency and with the prior approval of the Commission, the Procurement Committee shall deliver to the Commission a notice of intent to award a contract exceeding the Thresholds as establish by Regulations promulgated by the Commission. No Procuring Entity shall enter into a procurement contract above the Thresholds establish by Regulations promulgated by the Commission unless a minimum of fourteen (14) days have lapsed since the notification of intent to award a contract was delivered to the Commission. The Commission shall cause a notice of intent to award a contract whose contract price exceeds the Thresholds in the Regulation to be published within two (2) business days of receipt of such notice. A Procuring Entity may award a contract whose contract price is less than the Thresholds in the Regulation without notice to the Commission and passage of a minimum of fourteen (14) days as provided in this subsection (I).

The Commission may request the Procuring Entity to furnish supporting documentation demonstrating compliance with the provisions of this Act. Thanks for your usual cooperation and understanding.
