Subj: **REQUEST FOR "NO OBJECTION" TO USE THE SOLE SOURCE METHOD OF PROCUREMENT TO AWARD CONTRACT OFF THE E-PROCUREMENT SYSTEM TO K. DUKULY AND SONS FOR THE SUPPLY OF FOUR THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED TWENTY (4,220) BAGS OF 25KG RICE FOR THE PRISON FACILITIES.**


We present our compliments and wish to acknowledge receipt of your communication dated January 19, 2026, which sought the approval of the Commission for the Ministry of Justice (MOJ) to use the sole source method of procurement to award contract off the E-Procurement System to K. Dukuly and Sons for the supply of four thousand two hundred twenty (4,220) bags of 25 kg rice for prison facilities at an estimated cost of seventy three thousand eight hundred fifty United States Dollars (US 73,850.00).

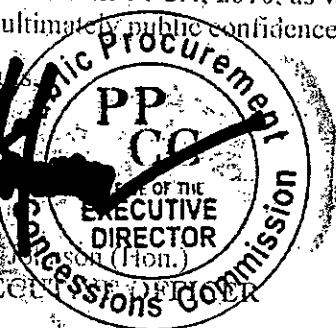
The Commission upon thorough review of your documentation submitted reveals that the Ministry of Justice's request was accompanied with adequate documentation and is in keeping with section 55 (1) (d) of the PPCA, 2010. Therefore, the Commission hereby grants an approval to the Ministry of Justice (MOJ) to award contract off the e-Procurement System to K. Dukuly and Sons for the supply of four thousand two hundred twenty (4,220) bags of 25 kg rice for prison facilities manually at the above estimated costs.

Additionally, the Commission hereby grants approval to the Ministry of Justice SBA Procurement Plans (Supply of Rice for Prison facilities) for Fiscal Year 2025 in accordance with Section 40 (3) of the PPCA, 2010, and informs Ministry of Justice that its SBA Procurement Plans for 2025 will be duly forwarded to the Ministry of Finance and Development Planning (MFDP), and that the MFDP will process allotments in keeping with the approved procurement plan. The Commission counsels that you observe Section 40 (5) of the PPCA, 2010, which states *each Procuring Entity, shall, on a quarterly basis and whenever it becomes necessary, review and update its procurement plans and notify the Commission in writing and the Minister of Finance of any material changes in its plan. However, an updated procurement plan shall accompany said notice to the Commission.*

The Public Procurement and Concessions Commission admonishes and deems it a priority that you remain in compliance with the PPCA, 2010, as we jointly aspire to achieve transparency, accountability, fairness, equality and ultimately public confidence in our procurement and concessions processes.

Subject: Request for No Objection and Dispensation for the manual procurement plan – Emergency Supply of Rice to Prison Facilities.

The Ministry of Justice respectfully submits this request for No Objection to single source rice for all prison facilities across the country and dispensation for the use of manual procurement plan in this regard.

As you are aware, the 2025 National Budget has expired, and the 2026 budgetary and procurement processes are still pending. In order to avert a potential national security crisis arising from food shortages in correctional facilities, we seek your approval to engage our previous vendor, K. Dukuly and Sons, for the emergency supply of rice. This emergency procurement is strictly transitional, pending the completion of the 2026 budgetary and procurement processes. Please see details as follows:

Commodity: Rice

Quantity: 4,220 bags

Weight per bag: 25 kg

Duration: Two months (January and February 2026)

Vendor: K. Dukuly and Sons (previous supplier with proven capacity and reliability)

In light of the above, we kindly request your approval to proceed with this emergency procurement arrangement. We assure the Commission that all subsequent procurement for prison facilities will be conducted in strict compliance with the Public Procurement and Concessions Act once the 2026 budget is approved.
